the river. We caught fish on drop shot morning dawn, reapers, Texas rigged worms, and brush hogs, crankbaits, and spinner baits. I used a lot of jigs for a long time and never caught a fish. We did have a lot of fun, but we didn't catch a lot of fish; maybe 8. We have a lot of very good fisherman in this club which makes us all fish hard.

Conservation Update By Gary Grimes

The Arizona Game and Fish Commission has decided to spend \$356,000 to reverse an alarming decline in the bass populations at Roosevelt Lake by introducing fast-growing Florida strain bass, conducting ongoing research, and scattering artificial reefs to help the bass get enough to eat. The state will also investigate turning a warm-water fish hatchery into a breeding facility for Florida strain bass.

We motored to mid-lake in a pre-spawn area, throwing cranks across shallow rocky reefs. Finally, a fish in the boat! We caught 4 on cranks, one a 3.65 pounder, was our gift of the day! Four more on Yamamoto smoke jigs, than 4 more slow rolling a Sweetwater spinner bait. I love that bite! Couple more small ones in the afternoon on jigs filled out our day of 15 fish. We did not leave our area mid-lake all day, except the last hour. In the winter, my thought is to not leave an area that produces fish, as they moved up all day long, giving us a decent weight for Bartlett winter fishing.


As boat Captain Asmus and I were heading home we realized what a great day it was to be named "Gary". It seemed that everyone with the name Gary cashed in. Well

almost everyone Mr. President (sorry, Asmus made me write that).

For me it was a day that didn't make sense. In the winter all I hear is the fish are deep, use jigs to get down where the fish are. Wrong! Gary caught 2 fish around 3 lbs on a spinner bait in 10 feet of water before the sun came up. Then another in 6 feet around 9 AM on the same spinner bait in the back of a cove. The last few were on drop shots along the main points throwing into the shallows. We also threw cranks, jigs and tubes with no luck.

I guess the moral of the story is to try it all as you never know what the bite is going to be.

Gary Asmus: I fished with Mike Adamson, a new member in our club. I had a spot that I

The first few casts produced three of our five fish at almost 8 lbs and we figured it was going to a great day, and then it got tough for us. We only caught about 7 or 8 fish for the day but enough for 3rd place and a nice 3 lber for 2nd big fish. We caught our fish on spinner baits and drop shot rigs. Mike was great to fish with and I am looking to fish with him again soon.

Of course, the morning of the tournament, the bite was gone. So, we headed up the river but the spinner bait bite wasn't there either. Don ended up catching fish in shallow water up the river with a hula grub jig in green pumpkin. All the fish caught, were up the river in shallow water near rocks. Don caught all the fish we weighed so by the end of the day, I was really good at using the net!

Not only did I have a great time fishing with Don, I gained a new friend.

Alauria & Zimmerman Overcome Adversity in 5th Place Finish

A five fish limit weighing 9.19 lbs was enough to earn Tom & Keith the **5th Place** money.

Zimmerman: Keith Tom Alauria's computer is on the fritz, so he asked me to provide our input regarding our fishing prowess at Bartlett. The best bite we found was early in the AM; however, we caught fish all day. Unfortunately we had a problem putting fish in the boat. We had fish to the side of the boat only to have them spit the hook, break our lines, and in one case straighten out a Gamakatsu hook. We caught fish drop shotting and on crank baits.

The primary problem we had was we were unable to keep any fish alive even after we dropped C4 and primer cord in deep water. We'll have to work on our technique. I'm certain Tom didn't want me to divulge all this info. But you know me. Ok, Ok, you all know this last paragraph is a joke! No explosives were used during this tournament.

Team Jeff Mabry & Brian Jacobson Win Final Prize Spot with 6th Place Finish

With a five fish limit weighing 8.99 lbs Team Mabry & Jacobson worked the main lake for their **6th Place** finish.

Jeff Mabry: Brian Jacobson and I started fishing in the marina area throwing spinner baits and cranks baits. We got our first two in that area on crank baits, but it shut off pretty quickly. We then stayed in the main lake area and worked some rock piles that I had

marked pre-fish. Brian in managed two more dragging the drop shot while I looked for the rock piles and tried to hold the boat steady in the wind. I really can't remember who caught our fourth fish, but I would bet it was Brian! Our 5th fish came off of a main lake point on a Texas rig. Our first five all ranged between 1.25 and 2 pounds; not bad for Bartlett, but not good enough.



6th Place

We managed 4 more rats after that and later in the day went back to the marina area where I made a decent upgrade on a jig fairly shallow and shortly after Brian caught our biggest fish. Apparently you had to be named Gary to get a good check in this tournament, but what happened to Grimes?

Brian is a real good fisherman and understands how to fish from the back of a boat. He out fished me on this day and got our biggest fish. It was great to get to fish with him.

Jack and I started fishing at the rip rap by the dam. His trolling motor would not work so we spent time fixing the problem. The wind was so bad we decided to go across the lake to get a break from the wind. After a while Jack caught our first fish on a small crank bait.

Sometime later I caught a fish on a Baby Bass crank bait. Things just turned off until about 12:30 PM and then we had moved back to our starting point (trolling motor would not work Jack got it going again) when Jack picked up our third fish. We were moving towards the marina. Then we bumped into Steve Cook and Jack told him not to catch his fish and proceeded to boat our fourth fish.

I was taking the fish out of the net when the hook went into my finger. Jack cut the hook off the lure and then Steve came along side and Jack held his boat to ours and Steve tied some braided line on the hook. He held the hook down to my finger and popped the hook out. I got to tell you that hurt. Thanks Steve! We caught our last fish about fifteen minutes before going in to the weigh in. Thanks Jack I still had a great day with you on the lake!

The 5lb pot was not won so the pot of over \$1000 will carry over to next month. The pot should be worth about \$1150.

Everyone should have received the final tournament results sheet by now, so I won't bore you with prize amounts. Lets just say that we paid out \$1950 to the winners.



Weighing-In

Well it is the beginning of another tournament season and we have all our permits for 2014. As with everything in life there are always changes. Now before I get a number of emails saying the Fish and Game pamphlet says a river stamp is not required the regulations and pamphlet were printed when AZ Fish and Game thought they had an agreement with California. We have some new rules for the Colorado River that at the time of this writing are still not clear because of conflict between Arizona and California on river stamps (I hope it will all be we fish finalized before Havasu). Agreements with Nevada and Utah have been reached and are in effect, they eliminate the river stamp with those states. Also, now when you purchase a fishing permit in Arizona it is good for 365 days not for the calendar year.

One other new rule is starting tournaments. Due complaints. mostly from California and Texas. the National Forest service has directed the Tournament Directors when there is a small launch area to start their tournament outside of the no wake zone. They did not specify which lakes have small launch areas due to a number of reasons including no wake

zone change size as water levels change. I was pleased to see they trusted the tournament directors enough that they did not over legislate. I was advised by TNF personal the only lake they are concerned with is Saguaro at certain times of the year. The reason for this rule is to stop complaints from non-tournament fishermen when they are launching their boats that they cannot do it safely with so many boats in a small area. This is a rule we can easily live with and should have no effect on our tournament fishing. There are also new rules on ages that require a license, boat driving and urban fishing, if you have young children or grandchildren check out the new rules.

With the first tournament of the vear successfully completed it brought to my attention a vital piece of equipment most of us do not pay attention to; your First Aid kit. Having carried a kit on board for more than 10 years and never using it I paid little attention to it. This past December I took my twin grandchildren fishing and their mother insisted I check out my first aid kit and sure enough some items were way out of date and had to be replaced. Well we had a great time and no need of the kit. However, during the Bartlett tournament my coangler, thanks to a largemouth that did not want to be in the boat, got a number six treble hook deeply imbedded in his hand and I mean deep. Between Steve Cook and me we were able to remove the hook and apply first aid to a hand that did not want to stop bleeding. Ironically several items I replaced last month were the item we needed most and used. My suggestion is check out your on board first aid kit and make sure the antiseptic for one thing is not out of date. It is really important when dealing with a fish hook injury.

Finally, I want to thank each of you for camaraderie, good conduct, and sportsmanship during the Bartlett tournament. During our weigh in we had several on lookers watching the weigh in and asking questions of members. I am positive they left the weigh in with a very positive attitude of bass tournament fishing, our members and club. This goes a long way in overcoming those who do not want us to fish at all!
