Taking home 1st Place, Team Burns & Jolley weighed the winning creel of five bass weighing 13.53 lbs. Thanks to one of the team member's 3.06 lb bass the team also won 1st Place Big Fish honors.

Neil Burns: I had the pleasure of fishing with Bob Jolley this tournament. We pre-fished Monday and settled on just a couple of areas on which we would concentrate on tournament day. Wednesday we were boat #1 so we ran up river and spent several hours throwing spinnerbaits and jigs.

I think we had 3 fish when we left the area. We didn't move far, just down from the nowake buoys to a little, steep, rubble, rock bank. We caught a lot of fish on drop shots and jigs and had a nice limit.

With about 2 1/2 hours left we decided to return to our start area. The wind was blowing hard, and while this made it tough to fish, I think it moved the fish to the bank, and made them a little more active. In the next couple of hours Bob upgraded with 3 nice fish. You know you're having a good day when you're culling and your partner says, "Are you sure this is the smallest one?" Thanks again Bob, I enjoyed the day.

Another well run tournament, entertaining pre-tournament meeting, and great job by the weigh-in team.



1st Place Neil Burns & Bob Jolley

Bob Jolley: First Place 13.53 Lbs. & First Place Big Fish 3.06 Lbs. Neil and I pre-fished on Monday and probably ended up with 8 or 9 pounds, some from the river and some from the main lake. Since we were the 'Number One' boat

we decided to head to the river at the start on Wednesday. Neil knew the river was a hit and miss area but he also knew the river had big fish, so we took a chance to see if we could catch some of them.

In the first couple of hours Neil caught three fish; a couple in the 1 lb. plus range and one around 2 lbs. We moved to another area of the river and started to catch more fish. Most of them were 1 to 2 lbs., except for our first 3 pounder which Neil caught.

With 2 ½ hours left in the tournament we decided to move again to try and upgrade our smaller fish. And upgrade we did with two more 3 pounders and a 2 ½ pounder. It was a great team effort as both of us caught big fish, none of the fish came unhooked, and there were no errors with the net. Neil did a great job controlling the boat in the wind which enabled us to stay on fish.

In all we probably caught 15 or 16 fish and the hardest thing for me was tossing 1 ½ and 2 pound fish back in the lake as we were culling. I told Neil that there were a lot of tournaments I would love to have had those fish at weigh in. All of our fish were caught on jigs, spinner baits and drop shot worms (mostly Morning Dawn) in less than 20 foot depths.

It was good to get back on the water again with Neil and especially good to get the win at Bartlett. It's probably been

four or five years since I last fished with Neil and I had forgotten how easy going and thoughtful he is. Neil is very accommodating to his coangler and a great fisherman to boot. I hope it's not another four or five years before I get paired up with Neil again.

Thanks to all the club volunteers for another well run tournament and to Gary Grimes for the ride down to the lake to release our fish!

Big Fish: Our three biggest fish were very close to the same size (3.06 lbs.) and two of them balanced exactly the same on the culling beam. We randomly picked one of those two for 'big fish' weigh-in, so I'm not sure if it was the one I caught on a spinner bait or the one Neil caught on a jig.

Tony Medina & Jim Buchanan Finish 2nd Overall

In **Second Place** the team of **Tony Medina & Jim Buchanan** weighed five bass for a total weight of 10.71 lbs.

Tony Medina: All I can say is this year's tournament was a whole lot better than last year's disaster. Last year my partner, Lionel took a bad fall coming down the ramp. As banged up as he was he still wanted to fish, so we tried for an hour until he told me he was having

2nd Place Jim Buchanan & Tony Medina

This year was totally the opposite. We finished in second place thanks to my

partner, and last year's Lunker of the Year award winner, Jimmy Buchanan, who at this tournament caught the third big fish, a 2.99 lb. beauty.

We started on nearby points on the main lake and had a quick limit. Then we spent the rest of the day fighting the wind and trying to upgrade our catch. We caught our fish throwing jigs, spinner baits, cranks and drop shot.

Jim Buchanan: Another great trip but it would have been nicer had the weather cooperated a little better. We fished the shore line close to the marina. By 8:30 AM we had five fish in the live well. My partner, Tony Medina, caught 3 fish before I had even caught one. Then he gave me one of his special lures, a 1/2 oz. jig head pumpkin colored twin tail

grub with a pumpkin skirt. Bingo, 4 and 5 fish in the well.

We caught a total of 10 fish the whole day.

Martlage & Adamson Crank & Jig Their Way To 3rd Place Overall

Team Gary Martlage & Mike Adamson weighed five bass for 9.85 pounds and took home Third Place honors.

Gary Martlage: I had the pleasure to fish with Mike Adamson for our 1st tournament of the year. I had spent a few days on Bartlett during the past month and had been struggling at best. During the winter, I usually spend most of my time fishing the main lake, but this year it seems that it has been producing very small limits of fish. Mike had pre-fished up the river a few days prior, so we decided "let's go"!



3rd Place Mike Adamson & Gary Martlage

Our first 2 fish came on crankbaits on shallow river rock banks, with Mike catching our first fish of the year; a nice 2.5 pounder! I put Mike on the front

of the boat, so he could continue to cast his crank, with me following up with a spider jig. I started catching fish in deeper water with the jig, so we backed off, and started fishing 20-30 feet. We spent most of the day in the deeper water, upgrading throughout the day. I really enjoyed the day with Mike, and look forward to fishing with him again!

Mike Adamson: We started cranking the banks first thing and picked up a few. While I continued to crank, Gary went to a jig and we were able to get our limit before the winds picked up. Throughout the morning we were able to cull up a number of times to get a respectable bag. Fish varied from 10-30 feet deep.

Team Senft & Brown Ride Carolina Rigs to 4th Overall Finish

Taking home **4th Place**, Team **Gary Senft & Rick Brown** weighed five fish for a total weight of 8.43 lbs.

Gary Senft: It was nice to meet Rick Brown who is a good fisherman. We really both fished very hard but had a good time. After I caught the first fish in a matter of minutes all of 10 inches long - we were off and running. We were both fishing Texas rigs and getting bites but not hooking the fish. Rick put on a Carolina rig and started catching fish. I started throwing a jig for quite awhile but not getting any fish. I finally put on a Carolina rig and we were catching fish and culling. We both used chigger craws and I also used brush hogs and watermelon jigs. The wind caused us to not fish the out side points that I really wanted to fish. I was telling Rick I think this club is the best run and the best group of guys in the valley.



4th Place Gary Senft & Rick Brown

Rick Brown: It was great to be back fishing with the club and seeing all the guys. Gary and I started mid-lake, I was throwing mostly a Carolina and Texas rigged Craw. Gary definitely puts in his time, and he put us right on the fish. I was bit on my second cast. Although the hook didn't set and it felt pretty small, it got me really exited that it was going to be a good day.

Soon after, Gary caught a small one, and threw it back. I think most guys would have kept it, but he was confident that we wouldn't need it, and I was with him on that thought. I kept getting bit by what we called "little peckers" and Gary soon said "let's get out of the nursery". He moved us and it wasn't long before I had a nice

2.5 lber in the boat from about 25 ft of water. Within the next hour or two I think we had our limit. The rest of the day we fished hard, fought the wind, and threw back little fish.

Congrats to Neal and Bob for a great bag. Thanks to Gary for putting me on the fish, and the club for putting on a well run tournament as usual.
