Water temperatures were fairly stable with 53 degree water in the main lake at the start of the tournament and 54 degree water near the Yellow Cliffs area. I believe it is safe to say that we offered just about all the lures you can think of to the finicky fish.

Our next club general meeting is scheduled for **Wednesday**, **1 February** starting at 8:00 AM, at **Deer Valley Airport Restaurant** (just one mile north of I-101 at the intersection of 7th Ave & Deer Valley Road). We hope you will come early and have breakfast together.

The next club point tournament will be at Lake Roosevelt on 15 February 2017. Club launch headquarters and weigh-in location will be announced. Tournament hours are Safe Light to 3 PM. Big Fish honors.

Gary Grimes: As is the case most other anglers. with catching a quality limit at Bartlett Lake is a challenge, but we found the right bites this time. I think it was more of a case of right place and right time than anything else. I was paired with Deb Cunningham, who is an awesome fisherman and a super co-angler. We caught most of our fish on the bottom using either jigs or a Carolina rig, in water that was about 20-25 feet deep. The exception to the jigs came in mid-morning, when I decided to throw a crankbait on a rockpile while there was a slight breeze on the water; our big fish, 3.28 lbs, hit my lure in about 5 feet of water.

Deb Cunningham: Gary and I had a great day on the water. Fishing was tough, but we had good timing for the spots we hit. We caught fish on Jigs, Dropshot, Crankbaits and Carolina rig. We found fish in 25 to 30 feet of water. Dave Baca taught me how to throw a jig years ago and it still works today. Big thanks to Gary Grimes he's a great fisherman and guide.

Richie Rojas & Todd Gentner Finish 2nd Overall

In Second Place the team of Richie Rojas & Todd Gentner weighed five bass for a total weight of 10.37 lbs. Todd Gentner's 2.65 lb bass took 2nd Place Big Fish honors.

We found some clear water and concentrated points and underwater on structure. John threw a Flick Shake, which he is very proficient at, and I threw a Carolina rig. We found our fish in 12 to 18 feet of water and were able to catch several limits.

Team David Baca & Tom Atherton Limit Early For 8th Overall Finish

David Baca: First I want to congratulate Gary Grimes and Deb Cunningham for an awesome job with their win. That 3 plus pound bass is a monster of a trophy for Bartlett. It is the largest bass weighed at a tournament so far this year at Bartlett where almost 50 boats fished last week and could not get one over 3 pounds.

I had a great day on the lake fishing with Tom Atherton, mostly in the middle lake toward the river. We only caught about 8 or 9 fish but the weather was great and Tom is a great guy to fish with. During pre-fish we found some fish in a few areas that were holding some decent Bartlett bass and discovered that our best bite would be on small brown or cinnamon colored double tail jigs, worked very slowly in 12 to 20 feet of water. One problem we had was we ran out of the small jigs and during the tournament we had to cut about an inch off the middle of the bigger ones and alue them super back together. This worked well and we wound up catching all of our fish on them except for 1 drop shot fish.

The bite started fairly well and we had a limit by about 8:30. By 11:00 AM our bite was over

but it was replaced with some great warm weather which quickly thawed us out from the cold.

TOURNAMENT RULES: After four years of the same rules by the Forest Service on all lakes for tournament fishing, it has come to an end. For some unexplained reason we now have different rules in every Forest Service district. Some of the rules make absolutely no sense and are so vague they cannot be clearly defined. An example is no fishing within the perimeter of a marina. It sounds simple enough until you go to a and realize lake marina perimeters are not clearly marked or defined. Midweek Bass Anglers has met with each district and will continue to meet with them for clarification or restatement of the old national rules. In the mean time we will provide detailed rules for each lake that we fish.
