Taking home 1st Place Overall, Team Laron Porter &Terry Johnson brought to the scales the winning creel of five bass weighing 11.82 lbs. Thanks to Terry's 2.64 lb. bass the team also took home 2nd Place Big Bass honors.

Terry Johnson: I had the pleasure of drawing boater Laron Porter for this tournament. He took very good care of an old man! He also found fish during prefish and took us right to them, way back in the No Wake Zone of Humbug Bay. Muddy water and tons of shad. A few minutes after we pulled into the back of a cove, I yelled "Fish On!" It turned out to be our big fish of the day. At 2.67 pounder, it was good one by Un-Pleasant standards, but as it turned out it was far from the tournament Big Fish of the Day. Laron netted it like a Pro, and we were

quickly back in action. A few more casts and I was again calling for the net. This bass was a shade smaller (but fought harder!), and it was tongue hooked. I was totally impressed by how carefully Laron unhooked it, to reduce the chance of a bleed out. And with that bass, my friends, I was done for the day. I just did not know it yet.

I continued working my Megabass S-7 Squarebill (shad pattern) and a bunch more baits off and on all day long. But no more love for me. Fortunately, as we repeatedly worked

from the back of the cove out into Humbug proper and back again, Laron kept catching bass, both black and white. Most were caught on deeper diving crankbaits but one was a jerkbait keeper. Our fish all came from 25 ft up to 3-5 ft, along rocky banks and mostly with immediate access to deeper water. Two of Laron's keepers came from the same spot, but an hour or two apart. We culled twice, the second time dumping that very lively tonguehooked, non-bleeding bass of mine. The only mistake we made was not keeping a 2.5 lb white bass that Laron caught, for Goon Fish. We thought surely someone would catch a big striper or catfish. Wrong! But we also didn't want that white to somehow mess up our "real" fish or dirty Laron's livewells.

We threw a lot of different baits throughout the day, but for us it was totally a crankbait day. It was my first ride on a Vexus and that boat was everything it was cracked up to be. My favorite thing was the great rod tubes for a co-angler's sticks. Wow! Greatly reduces the chances for a wayward treble hook to find the Co's seat. And what a stable ride, which was good because at 2:39 we (Laron) noticed the time! Laron stayed at No Wake speed all the way to the front of Humbug and then we shot back to the 3:00 weigh-in for our flight with a few minutes to spare. Well done, Laron.

Many thanks to Laron and to the guys who worked the launch, scales and trailering. Thanks to Gary Grimes for encouragement and for hauling our fish back to the lake. Thanks to Greg Utton for the photography effort which I am looking forward to seeing. And, thanks to the Girl Scout who sold me 4 boxes of Thin Mints – for my wife. It felt great to fish Midweek again. Especially with a Boater who was so kind and gracious in coping with my increasingly Old Man frailties. Oh, to be young again!

Drop Shot Is Magic For Team Goettl & Fraczek 2nd Place Overall

In **2nd Place** Team **Andy Goettl & Sebastian Fraczek** weighed two bass for a total weight of 7.37 lbs. Thanks to Andy's 6.85 lb bass they also won the **5 lb honors**.

Andy Goettl: Although we took second place there really isn't much to write up. We headed straight for Cole's Bay and tried reaction baits all morning with no results. I moved around a bit but not a whole lot. About 3 hours into the day Sebastian barely knew he had a Drop Shot bite and managed to land a small fish. I put 40 gallons of water into the livewell to store our six-inch bass and hoped that at least something would happen in the next few hours or it was going to be a long day. About 1PM we had enough of the donkeys in Coles and decided to try a few main lake spots.

We pulled up on a known spot and I tied on a Spro DD Little John and gave it a toss. I hit

a rock or two and the crankbait just stopped. Honestly, I thought I had a snag. The day had been so long and frustrating that my concentration had waned at least an hour before. I yanked a couple of times and reeled up some slack to try the snap trick, when I felt the head shake. I said," Crap, I think that's a fish!" As I started to reel the fish in, it rolled off the boat about 15 yards out and we thought maybe four pounds at best. It wasn't until Sabastian scooped her into the net and laid her on the deck, that I realized just how big she was.

Two fish for second place. Better lucky than good I guess.

On tournament day we stayed in the main lake, fishing the underwater humps, hoping for a better bite than it produced. We got "lucky" having 6 bites all day, and landing 4 fish. I did lose a small fish at the boat, but we came back to the exact spot 30 minutes later, and we still believe Keith caught the same fish in the exact same spot it was lost! Not much else to report, as we drop shotted 4.5 inch worms all day in 20-50 ft of water to get our bites; can't

Tournament Statistics

Sixty contestants fished 8 hours each, bringing 35 bass to the scales for a total weight of 69.43 pounds with a 1.56 pound average total catch per fisherman. The average weight of each fish was 1.98 lbs. All fish but one were released alive back into the lake after weigh-in to fight again another day.

Team Duel & Utton Work Drop Shot For 4th Place


Taking home **4th Place**, Team **Jim Duel & Greg Utton** weighed two fish for a total weight of 4.99 pounds.

Greg Prather & Eliseo Flores Take 5th Place


A three fish bag weighing 4.97 lbs was enough to earn Team **Prather & Flores** the **5th Place** money.


