Since we are unable to have face to face monthly meetings because of Covid (damn-it!!), let me educate you and remind others of our basic tournament protocols. Firstly, pay your boater. We have listed the amount to pay for each lake on the tournament entry form. Pay your boater before you begin. Don't want to pay, then don't fish. These fees are a pittance compared to the cost of most of the boats on the water. Secondly, be at the mandatory pretournament meeting. Third, at the start you must idle your boat beside (20 feet) and beyond the start boat. Do not attempt to get on plane until you pass the start boat. Fourth, know your boat number and which flight you are in, as well as what time you are supposed to return. Return late? DQ. Problems on the water? Call

We finished the day fishing in the Log Corral Cove area, where I caught the 5.32 lber. which hit the A-rig with a vengeance. Overall, we had a great day and caught around 15 fish total.

Great news for our Alamo tournament. Gary Martlage secured the group use area for our tournament. NOTE: We have the smaller Group Area 'B', located next to the one we normally use.

This site is available starting Sunday afternoon, and we must be out of there by Wednesday afternoon. So, make sure you clear all your stuff out of the site before you drive down for the tournament on Wednesday morning. You still have to pay to use group use; the cost is \$15 per day, and you must register at the Ranger Station. There is no power or water, but there is a porta-potty and Ramada.

few other fish I managed to catch were with my trusty Shakey head on my Dobyns Fury 7' medium-heavy with 12 lb Pline. Being new to using the A-rig I probably wouldn't have lost it had I used 25 or 30 lb line, as my partner did, on my Dobyns Fury heavy 7' casting rod.

For the fish we caught, we did best on edge drop-offs, areas close to cages (habitat), main lake points and river flats. We pretty much covered the lake from river to dam looking for and casting to staging pre-spawn bass. It was a fun day.

Tiny Lures Work Magic For Team Baca & Matt 2nd Place Overall

In **2nd Place** Team **David Baca & Joe Matt** weighed five bass for a total weight of 9.66 lbs.

David Baca: First of all, congrats to Phil and Amaro for the great finish and proof there still is a bass over 5 lbs. in Bartlett. I also want to thank my co-angler Joe Matt who contributed to a great day on the water. The weather turned out better than I thought it would along with the wind that allowed us to be able to focus a little more on the fishing and having a great time on the lake.

Our first two fish were our best ones and they came on a pumpkin single tail Yamamoto spider jig in 2 to 6 feet of water. We cut the fourinch jigs down about a 1/2 inch to make them as small as we could. What is really crazy is that about 20 years ago I had to make my jigs as big as I could to get a quality bite and fish them very fast. It has taken me 20 years to finally down size as small as I can and fish them as slow as I can to get a decent bite on Bartlett. What a pain until you catch a fish and then it gets a little more tolerable. I think all of our fish came on the small jigs and most of them were in 2-8 feet toward the back of coves around rocky structure. Thanks to all who give of themselves and time to put on a great tournament. As soon as I get our home completed, I will be able to fish more of these events.

We stayed in the same area for a few hours and had 4 in the boat, one being a nice 2 plus and decided to move. Nothing else seemed to produce for us until we headed over to a bank close to Rattlesnake, I handed Rod one of my rods to get a feel for it as I had been telling him how much I liked it, a few casts later he stuck our second-best fish and we had our limit. cove and deep-cuts four days later.

Ask yourself, would you rather catch our limit of five fish and then hunt for a kicker, or catch a kicker early and stress-out the rest of the day about not being able to add anything of size to it. Let me tell you when you cull and upgrade for an ounce at a time, it stinks. Bob Jolley and myself had a fun couple of days trying to figure out those fish and that lake.

We caught all our fish on drop shot and jigs. Nothing special here. We started on points and moved in toward the banks throughout the day finally locating them closer to the bank. Our big fish actually slammed a jig, not a pressure bite, so I knew it was a good one when I set the hook. I must say It's always a good time fishing with Bob Jolley.

Bob Jolley: Todd and I pre-fished on Saturday and caught nine fish which were typical cookie cutter size for this time of year at Bartlett. On tournament day we caught ten, mostly small fish, until Todd hooked into our kicker bass that weighed 3.14 pounds. This catch got us to our seventh-place finish and 'Big Fish' money. Todd and I spent most of the day on the main lake, with frozen hands, fishing drop shots and jigs which were the two techniques that caught our five biggest bass.

This was the first time I have been paired

One other note is on boater/boat safety. There was a report of aggressive driving (being way too close at a high speed) during our takeoff. Also, I observed a boat in the top 6, that left 200 yards from the start boat. Guys, we have rules in place for a reason. Passing the start boat in single file, in numerical order, keeps both of these things from happening. By leaving in order, it keeps a safe spacing from your competitors, and will avoid most issues. In the future, we will be spacing individual boats at a slower pace, and please note **YOU CAN BE DISQUALIFIED** if you do not idle pass the start

boat within 20 yards. Please don't put me in the position to **DQ** you.
