President's Perspective By Gary Grimes

It was a very difficult day of fishing for the 30 boats who battled it out at Lake Pleasant for our August tournament. Thirty boats fished from safe-light until 11AM, battling it out in the summer searching for heat, quality largemouth bass. Most teams caught limits, but not all. For those who caught fish, the common seemed be 40 feet to Congratulations to the team of Greg Utton and Tom Alauria on the victory with a 3 fish bag totaling 8.69lbs., anchored by a 4.60lb. beauty.

A few notes from the tournament.

* During a tournament, if a team catches a goon fish so large as to not reasonably be expected to survive in the live-well all day long, or such fish is so large that it will affect the survivability of the bass if it is kept in the live-well all day long, then that fish may be weighed on the lake during the tournament and released. The weighing of the large goon-fish must be done by a team that is also fishing the Midweek Tournament, but it has to be a team other than the team that caught the fish. A photograph is

also recommended. After a weight is verified by both teams, write the weight down and release the fish. At the weigh-in, tell the Tournament Director what you caught, how big it was, and who verified its weight. In the event that this happens to more than one boat during a tournament, if the weights of the two fish are within 10% of each other, then a tie will be declared (this is done because of using two separate scales). This is a rule we have been following for a couple of years now.

* You must notify the tournament director if you are not weighing fish. Either because you leave the tournament early, or you finish the tournament with no fish. Let us know so we don't waste time looking for you.

with Tom and it really worked out well. Hopefully, we'll get to do it again some time.

Tom has been fishing Lake Pleasant for over 50 years and knows the lake. With that background, we decided to have Tom run the front of the boat. We went to Tom's cove and spent the whole day there. We knew there were fish there and there was no point spending time looking for fish all over the lake.

Drop shot worked for Tom right away. He caught two nice sized fish and then hooked his 4.60lb. big fish. We were using light tackle and had to play the fish carefully from 40 feet deep. This of course caused lots of stress. Tom was shaking like a leaf by the time we got it in the boat. That gave us three fish and I later added another for a nice upgrade.

All fish were caught in 40 feet using drop shot and Robo worms. It was a long, hot grind, but it paid off.

Tom Alauria: Another good turnout at a lake that most fishermen hate. I had the pleasure of fishing with Greg Utton for this tournament. Greg asked me to run the front of his boat figuring that I knew the lake better than he. The only day we could practice was on Tuesday. We fished 3 hours and caught 2 small fish.

For the tournament I suggested that we

start in a cove that I was pretty sure held good fish. I caught two 2 pounders the first hour and an hour later I stuck the big girl. Greg then caught a good one and we culled. We never left the cove which is located near the 1702 sign.

All of our fish were caught in 40 feet using drop shot. I was using 8lb braid and 8lb leader and 6-inch MM3 Robo worms.

Team Grimes & Haas Fish Drop Shot And Jigs For 2nd Place Overall

In **2nd Place**, Team **Gary Grimes & Norm Haas** weighed three bass for a total weight of 7.45lbs. Thanks to Gary's 3.02lb. bass the team also took home the **2nd Place Big Bass** honors.

Gary Grimes: Norm Haas and I spent the majority of our day with our baits in 40 plus feet of water. It is difficult to fish efficiently at that depth, as it is hard to locate good structure. I like to fish a jig or C-rig at that depth, if for no other reason than I can more easily feel and interpret the bottom structure, like smooth sand or bumpy riprap. I also find it helpful to graph an area before dropping a line. After all, you will not get bit if there are no fish present. We caught about 7 fish all day, with our biggest 3 in the boat by 730AM. Norm fished drop shot and I fished a jig. I am thankful for Norm's skills at fizzing fish and keeping our fish alive and happy all day.

Norm Haas: Congratulations to Tom and Greg for their win. Thank you to weigh-in crew, tournament director and dock director Floyd Vaughan for running such a smooth operation. Very special thanks go out to my boater and current President Gary Grimes. He spent a lot of time explaining how to read all the graphs and how to target the larger fish.

We were fishing in what seemed like the middle of the lake most of the day. I was lucky to catch our first fish on a drop-shot which ended up being one of our 3 keepers. The rest of the day was all Gary including our 2nd Place big fish - I was happy to be the net boy. Everything we caught was deep and needed to be "fizzed", I got plenty of practice allowing us to cull multiple times returning healthy fish back

into the lake to catch another day.

Phil Brewer & Shawn Byrne Win 3rd Place Drop Shotting Deep Water

Team **Brewer & Byrne** weighed three bass for 5.80 pounds and took home **Third Place** honors.

Phil Brewer: First, congrats to Greg and Tom on the win. Great jobs guys. Next, thanks to the weigh-in team for a job well done, and a special thanks to my co-angler, Shawn Byrne, for kicking butt on the top water bite all morning.

We started on a spot close to the marina with no success. We then moved to a spot where I caught some fish during pre-fishing. Shawn caught several on top water boils and I stuck to drop shotting 35 to 40 feet and caught our bigger fish. For the tough conditions, it was a pretty good day overall.

Shawn Byrne: Had a great day with Phil Brewer and getting to know him. Phil found a few productive spots over the weekend and one produced for us all day. We were fishing islands and long points. We were lucky enough to get a few fish on clear and bone colored walking baits and poppers before the sun fully came up.

Other than that all of our other fish came out of 30-40ft of water with oxblood Robo worm drop shot in the trees and around submerged islands.

Thank you everyone who make these tournaments happen. I really enjoy Midweek and I try to actively recruit more anglers to join. Good luck to Phil for angler of the year!

Tournament Statistics

(Three fish limit) Fifty-nine contestants fished 5.5 hours each, bringing 63 bass to the scales for a total weight of 95.79 pounds with a 1.59 pound average total catch per fisherman. The average weight of each fish was 1.52 lbs. All but five fish were released alive back into the lake after weigh-in to fight again another day.

Gary Martlage: I had the opportunity to fish with a new member in the club, John Reyes. John is a "working man", so we couldn't get on the water until tournament day. I fished Friday, and Monday, knowing the lake would be tough come derby day. I found a few fish in 30-40 feet of water, with nothing standing out enough to change up the plan come tournament day. I met John at Wild Horse West for a rendezvous to load up the boat and go to the lake, hoping to at least have a burger after the tournament. John brought his usual co-angler gear; 6 rods and tackle. I think he was amazed that I only had 2 rods out; drop shot, and an ice jig, which I used for maybe 2 minutes of the day. We caught our fish on the dropper, off of main lake points and humps in 35-50 feet of water.

We stuck to the plan, even though we didn't have a fish in the boat until 9AM. We ended up culling 1 fish all day. John stuck a 3lbr with only 30 minutes to go; you would have thought he caught a world record. What a great guy who will be a future asset to the club. John, I appreciated fishing with you today and hope to draw you in the future, you're a hell of a guy!

Charles Mackintosh & Ray Riley Win 5th Place

Taking home **5th Place**, Team **Charles Mackintosh & Ray Riley** weighed three fish for a total weight of 5.54 pounds.

Charles Mackintosh: Congratulations to Greg Utton and Tom Alauria on their 1st Place finish! I had the pleasure of fishing with Ray Riley for this tournament. We caught a couple of fish on our 1st day of practice and followed that by getting skunked on our second day. Luckily a couple of guys from our club pointed us in the right direction, deep water.

For our third day of practice, we focused on structure in 40 feet of water and caught four fish on drop shots and jigs. Some areas showed many fish on the graph but few were in the mood to bite. Knowing how tough the bite was I downsized my drop shot leader to 6lb test. For tournament day we spent the day visiting 8 to 10 areas of structure at 40 feet in the main lake. From 7 to 8:30AM we generated four drop shot bites converting three of them to fish in the livewell. In the waning minutes of the tournament, I broke off our 5th and final bite. "Ray, thanks for not pushing me in the lake". The break off disappointment was softened by an unexpected finish in the money. Drop shot bait used was a 4.25-inch 5150 curly tail in Gary's favorite color. Thanks to the tournament crew for another smooth event. It is a pleasure to fish in this club and I am thankful for all I have learned from club members.

Ray Riley: First off, congratulations to the team of Greg Utton and Tom Alauria for a nice bag and also the big fish on a very tough tournament day. Also, a word of congratulation goes out to Gary Grimes and Norm Hass, along with all the other winners. As everyone who was on the water knows, it was a brutal tournament but as always, a couple of teams managed to overcome the handicaps and bring in a nice bag like Greg and Tom. We fished in 35-50 feet with drop shots and caught all of our fish on the Arizona Custom Baits 6-inch worm in the Punisher color. Most of our fish were on submerged islands and points. It was a slow day to start but
