Taking home 1st Place, Team Vern Ridgway & Gary Grimes brought to the scales the winning creel of five bass weighing 9.04 lbs.

Vern Ridgway: Hats off to the weight-in crew again; great job guys. The weather was great and the fishing was tough, but we gathered up for another Midweek Bass derby that proved to be great fun for most of us. I had one of the great draw partners in the club and he did not let us down. Mr. Gary Grimes and I teamed up and scratched out a victory.

Gary was out of town exercising his "ambassadorship" in Mexico and was unable to practice with me so I put in 3 days of practice working one end of the lake to the other. I caught lots of little fish and a few sizable keepers, but the indication was it was going to be tough fishing conditions and anybody's ball game.

I knew the fish had to be on points and that's where we caught most of the keepers in 25 feet of water. We threw everything and caught fish on blades, top water and Texas rigged creature baits. We kept moving and culling as we went. Soon Gary had culled out most of the first group of fish we caught. I think he enjoyed his "guided" trip on Alamo.

Gary Grimes: It is a real nice change of pace to fish from the back of the boat as a CO once in a while. You can really focus more on fishing, instead of navigating. Once again, I got to fish with Vern Ridgway, and it was awesome. He is always prepared, usually spending several days pre-fishing, as he did at Alamo. We caught some early fish with a combination of

In **2nd Place** Team **Randy Gray & Doug Moore** weighed five bass for a total weight of 8.34 lbs.

Doug Moore: First of all, congratulations to Vern and Gary for their win on a tough day. As always a big thank you to all who do the work to make these tournaments run so smoothly. I had the pleasure of fishing with Randy Gray, a seasoned veteran of Arizona lakes and his experience paid off for us. I was able to prefish with him Monday and he also fished alone on Tuesday and found a spot that was working well. We pretty much stayed there all day during the tournament fishing in 20 feet using drop shot, jigs and spoons. It was slow but we managed a limit by about 9:00 AM, including the "big" 2 pounder that Randy got on a spoon and then plugged away the rest of the day to upgrade. Randy got another 2 pounder on a spoon late in the day and that did it for us.

Randy Gray: Who would have thought 8.34 lbs for second place; 8.34 is barely honorable mention for a normal tournament. But I will take it. Congrats to Vern and Gary, a half pound kick was big at this tournament. How did Doug and I pull it off – slowly! I worked one spot because I didn't know where else to go, which made for a

Steve Grier & Joe Michels Work Hard For 3rd Place

Team **Steve Grier & Joe Michels** weighed five bass for 8.27 pounds and took home **Third Place** honors. Joe's 2.76 lb bass took **1st Place Big Bass** honors for the tournament.

Steve Grier: Congrats to Vern and Gary for a good bag on a tough day. Joe and I pre-fished on Monday and Tuesday. We went to the river to see if we could find a flip bite. We found one area where we got a few bites with a couple of decent ones. We also looked for an early morning crankbait bite and got a few bites with a couple of nice keepers. We spent some time down lake on points with little success.

Our game day plan was to crank early and then hit the river to flip looking for a bigger fish. We only caught one small fish cranking and after an hour headed to the river. We only caught 2 small keepers flipping with chigger craws and brush hogs in the river. In one area Joe noticed a top water swirl. Since there weren't any ducks in the area, he picked up a spinnerbait and cast toward the swirl. On the 3rd cast he caught the big fish. We left the river about noon with 4 fish. We went to a secondary point in a cove on the north side and in the first 30 minutes caught 5 fish to fill out our limit and cull with one about 2 lbs. We caught the fish on jigs and Carolina rigged brush hogs. We fished the rest of the day on points on the north side but didn't catch another fish that helped us.

Joe is an excellent fisherman and I enjoyed my time on the water with him. I am looking forward to doing it again. A big shout out to the weigh-in crew for another great job.



Joe Michels: I caught the "big fish" of the tournament! We were flipping up the river and had caught 2 small fish flipping, when I saw a sizable splash. I looked for a Grebe bird that made the splash and didn't see one, so I suspected a fish. I picked up a spinner bait, and began to fan cast where the fish splashed. On the third cast it hit. That made the difference in our bag at the weigh-in.

Team Amos Davis & David Sapyta Crank First Limit For 4th Place

Taking home **4th Place**, Team **Davis & Sapyta** weighed five fish for a total weight of 8.25 pounds.



We fished mainly in the dam area, using jigs and dropshot rigs. We caught 20 plus fish on tournament day, but nothing over 2 pounds. I caught fish on a 4.5 inch curly tail MMIII Roboworm, with Pat throwing a micro jig. Again, fishing was fun, but just couldn't get that kicker fish to put us over the top. I had a great time with Pat, and look forward to fishing with him in the future.

Sean Ballard & Greg Prather 7th Place

Team **Ballard & Prather** weighed five bass for 7.71 pounds and took home **6th Place** honors.

Sean Ballard: I had the pleasure of fishing with Greg Prather and had a blast. Even if you didn't know what my boat looks like you could tell it was my boat from a distance as I had an unusual 'lean' to one side. I took some time off work and was able to fish from Sunday to Wednesday, and I eliminated a lot of water. I caught fish from 0 to 30 feet during practice.

On tournament day we decided to target deeper bass on a long point. We picked up 3 fish early and then headed to the bank and picked up a small limit. We then headed towards the dam and caught 3 more bass and started culling. We moved across the lake and fished rock points and then after positioning the boat in 30 feet of water we cast to 15 feet and proceeded to cull all the way until it was time to go weigh-in. We caught over 20 fish for the day. Baits we caught fish on were jigs, Texas rig creature baits, Keitec swim baits and dropshot purple Zoom worms. I have to say the best thing that happened
