

Bryan Steele:

My gift to you all: Using the new Bow 360 unit.

Bow 360 Unit - Example

I generally use the bow 360 unit to show me where to cast and to help maintain good boat position while fishing offshore. I find that I need fewer waypoints, and I can't remember the last time I needed a marker buoy.

The picture on the left is a bow 360 screenshot while sitting on top of a roadbed at Lake Pleasant. The picture on the right is a Google Earth satellite view of the same location, but without water. After studying both pictures, it may give you an idea of how the bow 360 view represents what is around the boat. The better you are at interpreting side imaging--the easier it will be to interpret the 360 view.

Picture Annotations:


A: This is the main creek channel that flows back into the cove, and shows up as a dark area on the 360 view, because it consists of mud/silt. You can also see the minor creek bed that flows between A and B and connects into the main channel. Notice the shadow area on the 360 view beneath the letter A – it shows a drop-off into the channel.

B: This is a part of the culvert that goes underneath the old roadbed. Notice the rock pile below this culvert, which shows up pretty well in the 360 view.

C: This is the other end of the culvert. You will notice the darkened area below this culvert, which just means it is a soft, mud/silt area.

D: This is a rock pile that was placed across the roadbed.
