












 Payment will require a \$100 deposit with final payment due 90 days prior to the cruise date.

NEW SUBJECT: Lake Pleasant is no longer a free lake to fish tournaments. The city of Peoria has annexed the lake and is now charging for tournaments. Permit fee is very expensive compared to other permits. Currently it is \$150 for the permit, \$50.00 for the application and an additional \$150.00 for insurance. proposal by their city council will raise the fee to \$28.00 a boat plus \$50.00 for the application and insurance cost remains the same as of January 1, 2016. That would typically cost the club over a \$1000.00 for a 30 boat tournament compared to fishing Saguaro which is less than \$100.00. One club has already paid the current fees and one chose to fish it without a permit. The rumor that if we launch out of a private marina we do not have to pay is correct as long as you only fish in the marina. Once you leave the marina you must have a permit. We cannot afford to fish Pleasant under our current fee structure and Midweek Bass NOT fish Anglers WILL without permit а knowingly violate any law!




