As this year winds down to its end, I wanted to take a moment to ponder on some of the club's highlights of this past twelve months. We put a record number of boats on the water this year, and welcomed several new members. In February, our club assisted AZGFD with the construction of more habitats for our lakes. In March, we transferred our accounting to an online based software (boring, but it really helps keep better track of the money), which should help for future personnel changes on the board. In April, at Saguaro Lake, not one but two of our anglers caught 9 lb. fish. Tony Medina caught the bigger fish and ended up with the big fish of the year. Way to go Tony!

The month of May found us at Apache Lake, where golden algae

created a rather unique condition that caused a high concentration of fish way up river and almost all 30 boats to be fishing within a mile of each other at the river's beginning at the base of Roosevelt Lake dam, and we all caught plenty of fish. What a crazy and fun day it was, unfortunately Apache hasn't been the same since. Hopefully the fish recover over the next few months in time for our May 2018 tournament. June's excessive heat caused us to cancel the tournament at

Pleasant, Lake and unfortunately we were unable reschedule. July saw Midweek fish its first night tournament in vears Bartlett Lake. Though the fishing was a bit better than during the day, many of our guys have difficulty fishing at night so we are not likely to see a repeat of a night tourney any time soon.

By August, AZGFD had shut down Saguaro and Apache Lakes to tournament fishing due to the golden algae





















bloom. This caused poor Jack to scramble for new permits for different lakes, and as always he prevailed. In addition, in August we received notification from Friends of Reservoirs that we had been awarded a grant of \$35,000 to be used for habitat projects in our lakes. In October many from Midweek joined with the AZGFD for a three day habitat project at Roosevelt Lake where we assembled and installed over 400 pieces of structure. October also was Roosevelt Lake tournament, and many of us enjoyed a pre-tournament gathering at Boston's Lakeside Grill. We will have plenty of time to look at other locations for May and if the lake shows any sort of major fish kill took place in 2017 I am confident the club will not want to fish the lake if reports indicate a problem with the lake.

I will still be running the scales next year at each weigh-in, but will be looking for help commitments during the weigh-in procedure. If anyone is interested in committing to join the weigh-in team next year, shoot me an email, or call me to discuss this subject.

Weighing-In By Jack Hughes

Jack Hughes: Midweek Bass Anglers (MBA) has a solid reputation for being a first class club; supporting handicapped children's fishing tournaments, supporting AZG&F initiatives, and the enhancement of bass fishing for future anglers. All of these activities require time, money and often equipment. Let's take a closer look.

The members make a club and our members have been ethical anglers obeying the rules and regulations of both Federal and State. We have not had a member disqualified from a tournament the last five years for violating any Federal or State regulation. That does not mean the board looks the other way if a rule or regulation is not followed. What it does mean is our members obey the rules and regulations without trying to get around them. To the best of my knowledge not one member has been cited

for violating rules and regulations.

When it comes to supporting AZG&F there is not another club in the state that has raised though our members and affiliations the amount of money that MBA has. During 2017 MBA has through it's efforts provided funding of more than \$45,000 for fish stocking and the future of bass fishing in Arizona. When I was discussing with AZG&F personnel the club's support of the restocking program, Andy Clark, Deputy Manager of Warm Water Fisheries for the state, said "Midweek Bass is the Gold Standard of bass clubs in the state when it comes to supporting AZG&F". That is one tremendous comment!

Our members have given a lot of time and energy in supporting the restocking program at Roosevelt. For months they built habitat structures, then when the permits were in place spent three days with AZG&F and Tonto National Forest (TNF) personnel placing the structures in the lake. Both Tonto National Forest and AZG&F were very pleased with the results. In fairness there were also volunteers from other clubs and the Tonto Basin area providing manpower.

Yes, being a member of MBA puts you in some very good company because of all the good the club does outside of just bass fishing. However, when I look back at all of our volunteers for various efforts it appears to me it is the same members who are always volunteering. My guess is it is about 15% of the club. Our club has approximately 120 members and yes 15 to 20 members do the entire extra work outside of fishing. It would be a real help to the board members if more people volunteered during 2018. There are all types of tasks that have to be done to run a successful club the size of MBA. So the next time we need some volunteers think about it and give it a try, after all it's your club and I think you will find a lot of pleasure in helping out.
