Vern Ridgway: Bassin - "To be a successful fisherman you should get there yesterday when the fish were biting." What, where, and when to this is always the throw. question when time comes to do some angling and dangling; I've always tried to use the KISS system when chasing bass (keep it simple stupid). One would never think of this as my approach to bassin, however upon looking into my tackle box. vou'd see my tackle box is my boat.

But I, like most of you, buy "stuff" I think I might need, which results in lots of stuff. I try to use the basic colors as a starting point in any presentation, but will go

through several colors until I find what they want.

Our problem as fishermen is that we try to "force feed" them with what we think they should be eating, and sometime this chew's up the time clock, and in a tournament, we wind up chasing the clock before making the necessary adjustments to what the fish want.

Depending on the lake and time of year determines what should be thrown, always at first light I'll chunk some sort of reaction bait; if no action, I'll slow it down; that could be a Jig, Shakey head, Senko, Drop Shot, or Carolina rig. Now if at this point in time there is still no action, it's necessary to slow it way down, like watching snails crawl. This may be achieved with any of the tools mentioned above, we all have our favorites and I have mine. I'll start by throwing the bait up shallow and work it out to the 30 foot range, and sling it again until I find some action; the fish will tell you how deep they are; then focus may be given at the desired depth of the first strike.

I use a fairly simple graph system in which I watch water temperature, depth and structure as I go along. As I go along this may include primary points, secondary points, and miscellaneous structure such as boulders or "unusual shore line". One must always keep a sharp eye out for the fish birds, we want to catch fish, but they must catch fish as a condition of their survival.

The equipment I use is Shimano reels and Loomis and St. Croix rods.

There it is short and sweet, while angling, dangling, sweating and swearing.


